CONDITIONS OUTSIDE A WAREHOUSE THAT ATTRACT MICE

Conditions outside a warehouse that attract mice

The best way to keep mice out of a warehouse is to stop them at the perimeter. Eliminating conditions that attract mice to the outside of a building can reduce mouse problems inside the building. Once you have mice nesting or foraging around the outside of a warehouse, it's only a matter of time until they find their way inside.



Consider that young mice only need a slotted opening about 9.5 mm wide, just slightly larger than the thickness of the average pencil. Work with your customer to correct outside conducive conditions and establish a defensive perimeter around the warehouse.

Conditions that will attract mice to the perimeter of a warehouse

- Garbage stored closer than 15

- Open lids on dumpsters and garbage cans
- Odours from garbage or wild animals
- Warm, sun-reflecting walls in Autumn and Winter
- Piles or stacks of trash, building materials, pallets, etc.
- Equipment stored outside, especially in weedy areas
- Dense, low growing shrubs around foundations that provide cover and hide burrows and food trash
- Tall weeds, grass, or vines
- Weed growth along fence lines
- Fruit trees or crops within 50 meters of the building
- Large stones or rocks near the building
- Railroad tie edging
- Ditch, canal, pond, or other standing water near the building
- Areas of loose soil
- Gravel areas with rock of large diameter
- Guard dog house or penned yard
- Neglected sheds, garages, or other outbuildings on the property

Always remember that rodents need food, water and a place to stay and these are the focus areas during your inspection.
